Commissioning School Places in Essex 2017 – 2022

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Introduction

In its role as Commissioner of school places in Essex, the County Council compiles *Commissioning School Places in Essex* annually. It provides:

- Information on the current organisation of school places, and the existing capacities and number of pupils attending those schools;
- Forecasts of future pupil numbers; and
- Other contextual data.

Whilst *Commissioning School Places in Essex* provides the statistical data a second document, *Meeting the demand for school places in Essex 10-Year Plan* (latest edition [here](#)), provides the context and commentary information such as:

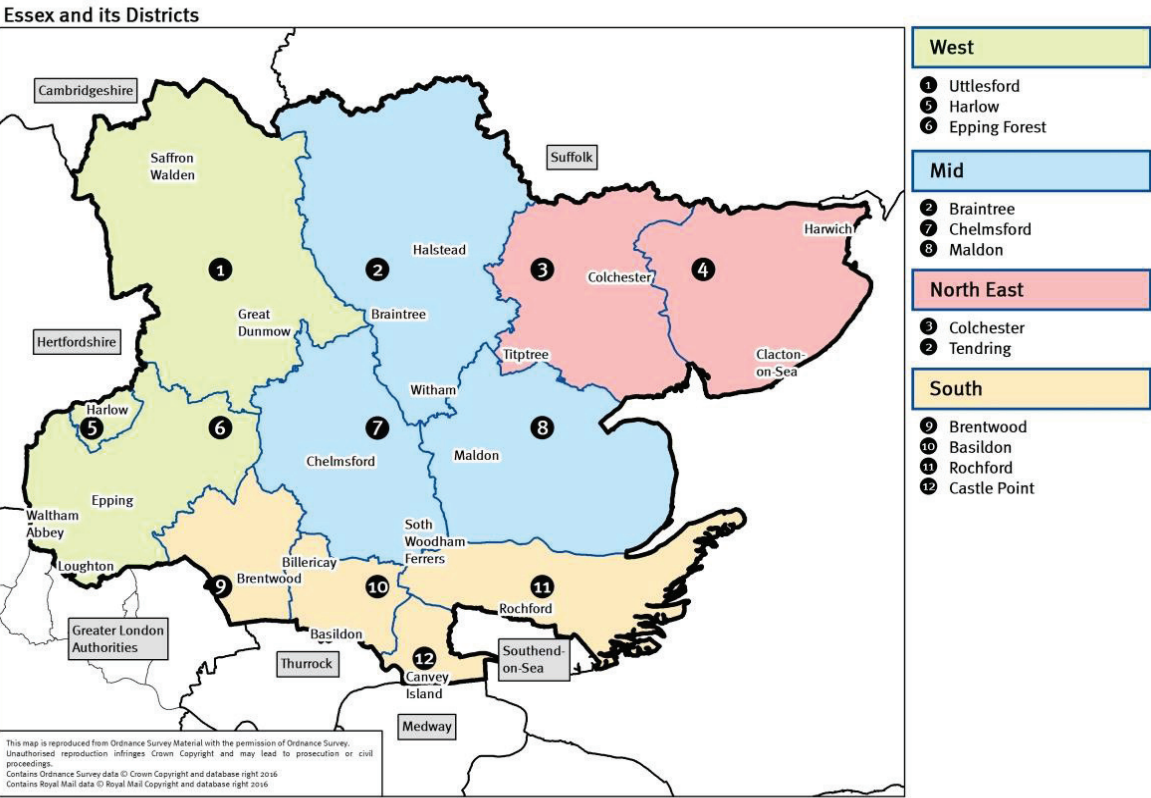
- how any increases in pupil numbers might be accommodated;
- how any surpluses could be addressed and
- opportunities that may exist for new schools to meet the needs of new housing developments.

Together, these documents help the County Council, schools, promoters, parents and local communities understand the need for school places and establish future demands.

Section A: Information relevant to managing the supply of school places

The county of Essex

In population terms, Essex is one of the largest UK counties with a population of almost 1.4 million at the time of the 2011 Census. The [2014-based subnational population projections](#) suggest that the Essex population will grow to over 1.5 million in the period to 2021. The largest Essex towns are Chelmsford and Colchester. The majority of the population live in smaller urban areas or in the county’s many rural communities. Population

Capacity of Essex schools

Capacity information for individual schools and aggregated to planning group and district level is included in [Appendix 1a](#) and [Appendix 1b](#). Information on temporary accommodation, included in the primary and secondary school net capacity figures, is also shown there.

The capacity figures for primary and secondary schools are calculated using the DfE ‘net capacity assessment method’ of assessing the capacity of mainstream schools to accommodate pupils, which provides the opportunity for capacities to be set at levels to suit reasonable admission arrangements and organisation of schools (including infant class size limits). For primary schools, the net capacity is calculated on the basis of the number and size of spaces designated as ‘class bases’. For secondary schools, the net capacity is based on the number, size and type of teaching spaces and the age range of the school. In both cases, this is checked against the total usable space available, and ensures that there is neither too much nor too little space to support the core teaching activities.

Academies

Academies are publicly funded independent schools. Appendix 1a Table 1 and Appendix 1b Table 1 list all Essex schools and academies as at the end of the 2016/17 academic year; academies are denoted by school type “A” in these table. Further information and a list of current academies can be found at Department for Education website - Academies.

For academies, capacity is set by the total number of pupils they have agreed to take in their funding agreement with the Department for Education or as amended in a subsequent deed of variation. Where there are temporary places shown, this indicates that an academy has a number of temporary classroom units as part of its teaching accommodation.

The number of schools in Essex

The number of schools including a breakdown by type of school is shown in Table 4, for Essex and for its four quadrants. The current pattern of school provision in Essex includes a diversity of schools with a religious foundation and background as well as the non-denominational schools established from public funds. The diocesan authorities and the Local Authority co-operate over planning school places to provide opportunities for parents to express a preference for denominational schools.

The number and type of schools can change over the course of an academic year, due to schools opening, closing, amalgamating, converting to academies and other changes. The count in Table 4 shows the position at the end of the 2016/17 academic year.

Single sex schools

Table 6 shows number on roll for single sex schools in Essex. There are five secondary schools in Essex which are single sex for year 7 admissions. Some of these schools have mixed sixth forms, as detailed in the table notes. The four grammar schools in Essex are single sex and the Ursuline Convent High School in Brentwood provides Roman Catholic denominational education for girls. The Campion School in the London Borough of Havering complements this for boys.

Grammar schools

In Essex there are four grammar schools that select on the basis of ability (shown as part of Table 6); two are located in Colchester and two in Chelmsford. The Chelmsford County High School for Girls and King Edward VI Grammar School (Chelmsford) converted to academy status with effect from 1 January 2011 and 1 April 2011 respectively. Colchester Royal Grammar School and Colchester County High for Girls converted to academy status with effect from 1 January 2012 and 1 October 2011 respectively.

The 2014 SEND code of practice removed the requirement for separate ‘school action’ and ‘school action plus’ categories – these were replaced by a single ‘SEN support’ category. The Children and Families Act 2014 replaced ‘SEN statements’ with ‘Education, Health and Care plans’. The exception is where a child has an existing statement and has not completed a transfer review to an EHC plan, in which case the 2001 code continues to apply. During the transitional period - to April 2018 - schools will be able to record pupils as having either ‘Statement’ or ‘EHC plan’.

Housing in Essex

Each Borough, City and District Council is required to objectively assess their housing need and develop a Local Development Plan to meet it. Objectively Assessed Need is defined as the full needs for market and affordable housing in the housing market area prior to consideration of constraints, and policy assumptions. The Plan making process is ongoing and even those councils with adopted Plans are required to review their documents to reflect, where applicable, higher housing targets. Before adopting a new Plan a series of consultations are required, culminating in an Examination in Public in front of an Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State. The process is governed by The Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012. Regulation 18 requires consultation regarding the preparation of a Plan. At this stage the precise location of housing proposals isn't fixed and, thereby, pupil numbers from such housing cannot be included in specific school forecasts. Regulation 19 consultations provide the public with an opportunity to comment on the draft Plan that the local planning authority intend to submit for examination. As such, these draft plans are much more specific and the housing detailed therein is included in pupil forecasts along with allocations in adopted Plans and other housing sites that have obtained planning permission outside of the Plan making process.

Five Essex districts have adopted Plans. These are shown in Table 17a.

Appendix 2: Forecasting methodology and forecast accuracy

Primary school forecasts

The forecasts are prepared using information on historical trends in admissions, current numbers on roll, the historic birth rate and current GP registrations in schools' admissions areas.

Numbers on roll are taken from the School Census pupil counts at May. The number of births and numbers of children in other age groups are obtained from GP registrations as collected from Essex Health Authorities and sorted into school admissions areas. Admissions factors are the percentage of admissions compared with the overall number of children in the admissions area. An average admissions factor, generally taken over the past three years, is then applied to GP registration numbers for the 0 to 3 year olds in the admissions area to predict future intakes to the Reception year. This is done at school level, forecast planning group level and district level.

School level forecasts within the forecast planning group may then be adjusted as necessary to tie up with the group level forecast. Forecast admissions for popular schools are set at published admissions number (PAN). In some cases forecasts are revised to minimise the impact of unusually high or low intakes in previous years or to reflect the rising intake shown in the allocation for next year, or in the light of known circumstances at the school such as changes to admissions arrangements or the provision of new accommodation. For each school, the one year ahead reception forecast is adjusted to reflect the current allocation of places as held in the co-ordinated admissions IT system, to make use of the very latest information. Then the current numbers on roll and forecast reception numbers are rolled forward a year group to provide forecasts for the next year ahead and so on for later years, to produce forecasts of pupil numbers for the next five years.

Secondary school forecasts

Pupil forecasts for secondary schools are constructed using current numbers on roll and historic trends in admissions from Year 6 in primary schools.

Numbers on roll are taken from the School Census pupil counts at January. Admissions factors are calculated as the percentage of Year 7 admissions into the secondary school compared to the number in Year 6 the previous academic year in the 'feeder' primary schools (for forecasting purposes feeder primaries are those schools where a significant proportion of pupils normally transfer to the particular secondary school). An average admissions factor, usually over 3 years, is then applied to the total in each year group of pupils attending the feeder primary schools to provide Year 7 forecasts. This is done at school level and at district level and for some forecast planning groups.

In a similar way as for primary schools, school level Year 7 forecasts within a district may then be adjusted as necessary to tie up with the district and group level forecasts. Forecast admissions for popular schools are set at published admissions number (PAN). In some cases forecasts are revised to minimise the impact of unusually high or low intakes in previous years or to reflect the rising intake shown in the allocation for next year, or in the light of known circumstances at the school such as changes to admissions arrangements or the provision of new accommodation. For each school, the one year ahead Year 7 forecast is adjusted to reflect the current allocation of places as held in the co-ordinated admissions system, as this provides the very latest information. Then, current numbers on roll and forecast Year 7 numbers are rolled forward a year group to provide forecasts for the next year ahead and so on for later years.

For schools with sixth forms, two further admissions factors are calculated using historical information comparing the number of pupils in Year 11 staying on to Year 12 and likewise from Year 12 to Year 13. Average sixth form admission factors are then applied to pupil numbers in Year 11 or Year 12 to forecast future sixth form numbers.

New housing element of forecasts

Housing sites are included in forecasts if they either have planning permission or are included in a Local Plan which has reached Regulation 19 stage. Information obtained from housing developers is used to provide the estimated phasing of housing developments. Where there is no specific information a formula is used to estimate the number of years to build and the number of units built per year. Actual developments and the rate at which units are built will depend on a mixture of economic and social factors.

The likely number of pupils that will move into a development and require a place at a local school is calculated using different factors for houses and flats. These are multiplied by the number of new dwellings to estimate the number of pupils that will be produced by a particular development. One bedroom units and certain other types of dwellings that are unlikely to house children are discounted from the calculation. The factors used for qualifying dwellings are 0.3 primary pupils per new house and 0.15 primary pupils per new flat, and 0.2 secondary pupils per new house and 0.1 secondary pupils per new flat. Finally, the impact of pupils from new housing over a number of years is modelled for a staggered effect, rather than the full pupil product being added from the first year the phase of housing is occupied.

Accuracy of forecasts

As stated in the DfE Pupil Projection Guide (2005), it is good practice to review the accuracy of previous projections as a starting point for the production of a new series of projections. In this way, inconsistencies or problems can be identified and corrected for. Accuracy can be measured both for the overall authority forecast and for school-level forecasts. The guide suggests a range of accuracy tests that can be undertaken and used to ensure the accuracy of projections in the future, which have been incorporated in this section.

In general, the accuracy of forecasts

- reduces when looking at individual schools;
- improves when the overall numbers in an area or larger district are considered; and
- reduces the further ahead the forecasts are for.

Measures of accuracy

There are various measures of accuracy used in the tables that follow. Definitions of the measures of accuracy are shown below.

- **Accuracy error** – the difference between the projection and the actual number of pupils, expressed as a percentage of the actual pupil count. An over-forecast is shown as a positive percentage whilst an under-forecast is shown as a negative percentage. For example, if the number on roll at a school had been forecast at 190, but the actual number on roll proved to be 200, this would equate to an under-forecast of 10 and the accuracy error would be given as -5%.
- **Average accuracy error** – the average accuracy error taken over all schools. This identifies whether school projections overall are under-projecting or over-projecting pupil numbers. Averages have been taken over all primary and over all secondary schools, for the whole local authority.
- **Absolute average accuracy error** – the scale of the accuracy error across all schools, ignoring whether they were over-forecasts or under-forecasts. This has been measured both in percentage terms and in terms of actual pupil numbers.
- **Degree of accuracy** – the percentage of schools with an accuracy error within 3%, 5% or 10%. Comparing sets of forecasts, the higher the percentage of schools having forecasts within 3% of the actual number of pupils, the more accurate the forecasts were.

Accuracy of forecasts at Local Authority level

According to the Audit Commission Trading Places management handbook, the one-year ahead forecast of total pupil numbers for both primary and secondary schools should differ from the actual numbers by no more than one percent above or below. The last national comparison was for forecasts of 1999/00, published in Value for Money Indicators: Planning School Places, PricewaterhouseCoopers 2001. Essex had a one percent percentage error in forecasting primary school places (near the median when compared with other similar authorities) and a less than one

percent percentage error in forecasting secondary school places (near the upper quartile when compared with other similar authorities). So the forecasts were within acceptable parameters of accuracy.

The tables that follow show the accuracy of the overall forecasts of total primary and secondary numbers on roll for Essex in 2014/15 to 2016/17, when forecasting one, two or three years ahead. The accuracy of the authority level one year ahead forecasts are within the Audit Commission one percent standard.

Appendix 4: Local Plan Progress

The Localism Act, 2011 abolished regional planning guidance which made the identification of local housing targets the responsibility of individual local planning authorities. Regional Plans, and their targets, were formally revoked by the Secretary of State in January 2013, and are no longer considered part of the Development Plan.

The National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) was published in March 2012 and seeks to boost significantly the supply of housing by local authorities. This was further supplemented by Planning Practice Guidance (PPG) in March 2014. Local Plans are expected to use locally generated evidence bases to ensure that they meet in full the 'objectively assessed needs' for market and affordable housing in their housing market area. Local Plans need to identify an annual supply of specific, deliverable sites to provide 5 years' worth of housing against their requirements, with a 5% or 20% buffer depending on past delivery. Local Plans should also identify a supply of specific, developable sites, or broad locations for growth, for years 6-10 and, where possible, for years 11-15. National Guidance in the PPG also requires local planning authorities to deal with undersupply within the first 5 years of the plan period where possible. Where this is not possible they will need to work with neighbouring authorities under a 'Duty to Cooperate' to address any shortfall. A high-level process or mechanism to guide how potential unmet housing needs will be considered across housing market areas/districts in Essex is being prepared by the Essex Planning Officers Association (EPOA).

The NPPF requires all new Local Plans to be consistent with its policies, and Core Strategy documents adopted prior to the NPPF are required to demonstrate their consistency with the policies within the NPPF. Consequently, there is a range of Local Plans currently adopted or emerging within the administrative area of Essex, and hence it is difficult to identify a single published housing requirement for the County. It will be a number of years until all Local Plans have been adopted consistent with the NPPF, and beginning to deliver the uplift in housing required by Government policy

The White Paper 'Fixing our Broken Housing Market' (February 2017) identified the need to increase the supply of new housing from 225,000 to 275,000 or more homes per year to keep up with population growth and to start to tackle years of under-supply. The existing problem in the housing market is considered to be threefold: not enough local authorities planning for the homes they need; a house building rate which is simply too slow; and a construction industry that is too reliant on a small number of 'big players'. In response, the Government is seeking to plan for the right homes in the right places, implement measures to build homes faster, and diversify the housing market. New measures will be put in place to speed up the delivery of new housing, including a new methodology for calculating 'Objectively Assessed Housing Need' (OAHN), which is expected to increase housing requirements. Consequently, the housing requirements identified in **Tables 17a and 17b** will be subject to further change.

All local authorities in Essex are preparing new Local Plans, underpinned by an objective assessment of their housing requirement, identified through a Strategic Housing Market Assessment (SHMA) and a Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment (SHLAA), for the period up to 2030 and beyond. Essex will need to build up to 136,000 new homes over the next 20 years. This will require a significant uplift in the delivery of additional housing. The majority of this growth will initially be directed to the existing major centres in the County within urban areas and strategic urban extensions.

However, several Local Plans are planning for growth beyond 2030 through the identification of several new Garden Communities. These new Garden Communities include the following in emerging Local Plans:

North Essex

- Tendring/Colchester Borders (7,000–9,000 dwellings, of which 2500 will be developed prior to 2033);
- Colchester/Braintree Borders (15,000–24,000 dwellings, of which 2,500 will be developed prior to 2033);
- West of Braintree (7,000–10,000 dwellings, of which 2,500 will be developed in Braintree district and 970 in Uttlesford prior to 2033);

West Essex

- Easton Park, Uttlesford (10,000 dwellings, of which a minimum of 1,800 will be provided by 2033);
- North Uttlesford, Great Chesterford (5,000 dwellings, of which a minimum of 1,900 will be provided by 2033);
- West of Braintree (see above);
- Gilston Area, Harlow/East Hertfordshire (some 10,000 new homes in 7 separate villages)

South Essex

- Dunton Garden Village, Brentwood (some 2,500 new homes by 2033, and 1,000 beyond)

Progress of Local Plans in Essex

1. **Core Strategy documents adopted prior to NPPF, and did not consider 'objectively assessed need' – Braintree; Chelmsford; Colchester; and Rochford. New Local Plans are being prepared for these districts within the context of the NPPF, and their progress is identified in sections 2, 3, 4 and 5 below.**

The adopted Braintree Core Strategy (2011) seeks to provide 4,800 dwellings over the period 2009-2026. As at April 2017 2,042 are outstanding, of which a significant amount has planning permission. It is estimated that the majority will be provided within the plan period of up to 2026, with a significant amount by 2021. Many of these sites will be rolled over into the emerging New Local Plan.

The adopted Chelmsford Local Development Documents (Core Strategy; Site Allocation; North Chelmsford AAP, and Town Centre AAP) seek to provide 14,000 dwellings over the period 2001-2021. As at April 2017 4,482 are outstanding, of which half is expected to be delivered by 2021. It is estimated that some 2,600 will be provided post the current Local Plan period of 2021 (primarily at Greater Beaulieu Park), and will be 'carried over' into the new Local Plan.

The adopted Colchester Local Development Plan (Core Strategy, Site Allocations, and Development Policies) seeks to provide 19,000 dwellings over the period 2001-2023. As at April 2017 5,414 remain outstanding, of which the majority have planning permission. Development is focused in the Colchester town centre and Growth Areas to the north, east, south of the town, and at Stanway. Many of these sites will be rolled over into the emerging New Local Plan.

The adopted Rochford Local Development Plan (Core Strategy, Site Allocations, Development Management Policies, Hockley, Rochford, Rayleigh and London Southend Airport AAPs) seeks to provide 4,750 dwellings over the period 2006-2025, at approximately 250 dwellings per annum. As at April 2017 3,091 dwellings are outstanding, of which the majority still require planning permission.

The four adopted Local Plans have been prepared using base dates between 2001 and 2009 and end dates between 2021 and 2026. In combination these Local Plans seek to provide 42,550 dwellings up to 2026, of which 25,949 dwellings have already been provided. Consequently 16,601 dwellings remain outstanding and a significant amount will be 'rolled' into the housing requirements of the emerging new Local Plans. These Plans will be based on a new 'objectively assessed need' requirement which is greater than their existing annual requirement.

2. Local Plan documents which have been subject to examination by the Planning Inspectorate, and have been found ‘Sound’ by the Secretary of State – Maldon

The Maldon Local Development Plan (LDP) was submitted to the Secretary of State (SoS) for Examination-in-Public (EIP) in 2014. EIP hearing sessions took place in January / February 2015 and covered matters of legal compliance and housing (including infrastructure). In 2015 the Local Plan was called in by the SoS following a request from Maldon District Council after the Inspector had recommended that the plan was not sound, primarily on Gypsy and Traveller matters. A new Inspector was appointed and further Examination Hearings held in January / February 2017. The Inspector’s Report was published by Maldon District Council in June 2017. Further Post Examination Modifications, were published and consulted upon in March / April 2017. The Secretary of State approved the Local Plan for adoption in July 2017.

The adopted Maldon Local Plan seeks to provide 4,650 dwellings over the plan period to 2029, and is based on its OAHN of 310 dwellings per annum (dpa). As at April 2017 approximately 4,333 dwellings are outstanding.

3. Local Plan documents which have been submitted to the Planning Inspectorate for examination, and have been ‘Withdrawn’ by the local planning authority – Castle Point

Castle Point Borough Council (CPBC) served Notice of Withdrawal of their Draft Local Plan in March 2017 following an examination regarding Duty to Cooperate. The Local Plan covered the period 2011-2031 seeking to provide 4,000 new homes. It was based on 100 dpa, which was significantly below its identified OAHN. The Preferred Options (2014) was based on an OAN of 200dpa. CPBC will continue to use its 1998 Local Plan for planning purposes.

CPBC is working with its neighbouring authorities in the preparation of the South Essex Strategic Planning Framework to be followed by new a Local Plan, with a first round of consultation scheduled for spring 2018. Further work is in progress to identify the housing requirement across South Essex.

4. Emerging Local Plan documents being prepared within the context of the NPPF/PPG, and which have been subject to a formal public consultation (Preferred Option stage/Draft Local Plan), and contain member endorsed housing provision – Basildon, Braintree, Brentwood, Chelmsford, Colchester, Tendring and Uttlesford

These Local Plans have been subject to a public consultation on their preferred spatial options, but are subject to potential change as they progress through the plan preparation process and the consideration of new evidence, including the assessment of their OAHN against evidence and any constraints.

The Basildon Draft New Local Plan (Jan 2016) sought to provide for 15,260 dwellings over the period 2014-2034 at approximately 763 dpa. As at April 2017 13,354 dwellings remain to be provided in the plan period. A Publication Draft Local Plan consultation is likely to take place in autumn 2017. Further work is in progress to identify the housing requirement across South Essex.

The Braintree Publication Draft Local Plan (June 2017) sought to provide for 14,320 dwellings over the period 2013–2033 at approximately 716 pa. The Draft Plan includes a single joint strategic plan, Section 1, which is also included within the Colchester and Tendring Local Plans. It addresses a strategic vision for how planned growth across North Essex will be realised, along with the potential infrastructure necessary to support the planned growth. The Draft Plan identifies two new cross border ‘Garden Communities’ at Colchester / Braintree Borders and West of Braintree, which could deliver up to 25,000–33,000 new homes in the plan period and beyond. Some 5,000 dwellings will be provided prior to 2033. The Local Plan (Section 1 and 2) is expected to be submitted to the SoS in October 2017 with the joint Section 1 of Braintree, Colchester and Tendring plans to be examined in early 2018. Section 2 will be examined later in 2018, subject to the recommendation on Section 1. As at April 2017 12,915 dwellings remain to be provided in the plan period.

The Brentwood Draft Local Plan (March 2016) sought to provide for 7,240 dwellings over the period 2013-2033 at 362 dpa. The Draft Plan identified growth on brownfield sites in urban areas (Brentwood/Shenfield), significant Green Belt release at West Horndon, and a new Dunton Garden Suburb (approximately 2,500 dwellings in the plan period with an additional 1,000 beyond). The OAHN has been revised up to 380 dpa, along with amendments to potential new site allocations. A ‘Housing and Employment Sites’ consultation to consider new and existing site allocations is expected in autumn 2017. It is likely to include an upward adjustment to provision of new homes required by 2033. At April 2017, 6,865 dwellings remain to be provided in the plan period. A Publication Draft is expected in spring 2018.

The Chelmsford Preferred Option Local Plan (March 2017) sought to provide for 18,515 dwellings over the period 2013–2036 at approximately 805 dpa. To ensure flexibility of supply, and to boost housing supply a further 20%, capacity is allocated over the plan period. The Local Plan is considering further significant growth in the Chelmsford urban area with further urban extensions in areas not

constrained by the Green Belt. It is expected that 2,600 dwellings will be carried over from the adopted Core Strategy (Greater Beaulieu Park) post 2021. As at April 2017 15,424 dwellings remain to be provided in the plan period.

The Colchester Publication Draft Local Plan (June 2017) sought to provide for 18,400 dwellings over the period 2013–2033, at approximately 920 pa. The Draft Plan includes a single joint strategic plan, Section 1, which is also included within the Braintree and Tendring Local Plans. It addresses a strategic vision for how planned growth across North Essex will be realised, along with the potential infrastructure necessary to support the planned growth. The Draft Plan identifies two new cross-border ‘Garden Communities’ at Colchester / Braintree Borders and Tendring / Colchester Borders, which could deliver 22,000–33,000 new homes in the plan period and beyond. Some 5,000 dwellings will be provided prior to 2033. The Local Plan (Section 1 and 2) is expected to be submitted to the SoS in October 2017 with the joint Section 1 of Braintree, Colchester and Tendring plans being examined in early 2018. The Section 2 will be examined later in 2018, subject to the recommendation on Section 1. As at April 2017 12,915 dwellings remain to be provided in the plan period.

The Tendring Publication Draft Local Plan (June 2017) sought to provide for 11,500 dwellings over the period 2013–2033, at approximately 550 dpa. The Draft Plan includes a single joint strategic plan, Section 1, which is also included within the Braintree and Colchester Local Plans. It addresses a strategic vision for how planned growth across North Essex will be realised, along with the potential infrastructure necessary to support the planned growth. The Draft Plan identifies a new cross border ‘Garden Community’ at Tendring/Colchester Borders, which could deliver up to 7,000–9,000 new homes in the plan period and beyond. Some 2,500 dwellings will be provided prior to 2033. The Local Plan (Section 1 and 2) is expected to be submitted to the SoS in October 2017 with the joint Section 1 of Braintree, Colchester and Tendring plans being examined in early 2018. The Section 2 will be examined later in 2018, subject to the recommendation on Section 1. As at April 2017 10,126 dwellings remain to be provided in the plan period.

The Uttlesford Preferred Options Local Plan (July 2017) sought to provide for 14,100 dwellings over the period 2011–2033, at a rate of 640 per annum. The Plan promotes three new Garden Communities at North Uttlesford (Great Chesterford) providing 5,000 new homes (1900 up to 2033); Easton Park providing 10,000 new homes (1,800 up to 2033); and West of Braintree providing some 3,100 new homes of the cross border community of some 10,000, of which 970 will be provided in UDC area by 2033. As at April 2017, some 10,190 dwellings remain to be provided within the plan period.

The Epping Forest Preferred Option Local Plan (December 2016) sought to provide for 11,400 dwellings over the period 2011–2033, at approximately 520 dpa. Work on the Local Plan is ongoing and involves co-operation with adjoining authorities (i.e. Harlow) to deliver the required housing due to Green Belt constraints in the district. As at April, 2017 some 10,212 remain to be provided in the plan period. A Publication Draft Local Plan is expected to be on public consultation in January 2018.

5. Emerging Local Plans which have not yet identified a future housing provision, and have not been published for formal public consultation (Preferred Option/Draft Plan) – Harlow and, Rochford.

A Harlow Draft Local Plan is being prepared to cover the period 2011-2033. In the interim Harlow is assuming a housing target of 9,200 dwellings to be accommodated within its administrative boundaries, which is an uplift from its OAHN of 268 dpa. Epping Forest, Harlow, Uttlesford together with East Herts DC (and ECC with Herts CC), have engaged collaboratively with Local Plan preparation to address housing and economic needs across the four LPAs. Focus has been on agreeing development sites in and around Harlow (approx. 16,000 new homes) to be distributed between Epping Forest, Harlow and East Herts. A new Garden Community is being proposed in the Gilston Area (Harlow/East Hertfordshire) to provide for some 10,000 new homes in 7 separate villages with the majority of growth post 2033. As at April 2017, some 7,827 dwellings remain to be provided within its administrative boundaries.

A new Rochford Local Plan is being prepared and will be based on an OAHN of between 312 – 392 dpa, subject to further evidence base work with neighbouring districts. An ‘Issues and Options’ consultation is scheduled to take place in late 2017. Plan preparation is at an early stage with a plan period, spatial strategy and overall development requirements yet to be determined.

The identified annual development rates in emerging Local Plans are generally regarded as minimum requirements. It is a requirement to provide for any ‘backlog’ in housing provision from the base date of the plan, and a 5% or 20% buffer depending on past delivery to ensure choice and competition in the market for land (NPPF, para 47).

Bearing in mind all of the above the housing requirements identified in Table 17a should be treated with caution, since they will be subject to potential amendment throughout the preparation and implementation of Local Plans, and any review to the evidence base and calculation of OAHN.
