Item 7 – Licensed Taxis – Policy Requirement for Euro 6 Compliance

Question from Mr W

I have a 2014 licensed Euro 6-Seater Taxi. The vehicle has very low mileage, it's in good roadworthy condition and passes the twice-yearly Taxi Test set up by the council. I do not understand why the council will not issue a Hackney License to this vehicle for 2026. The actual cost to purchase a new or second-hand Taxi is prohibitive at the moment. The economic situation in this country is not good and trade is down and I am unable to afford to invest in another vehicle. Why should I be forced into this situation of selling my current Euro Taxi when it is in good order and, "Fit for Purpose", it has no logic !!!.

I therefore request that this policy with regard to Euro 5 Engines should be scrapped for all 2014 licensed Euro 6 Seater Taxis and that they should be allowed to run/ be granted the Hackney License for 2026/27. There should be no fixed year to take these vehicles of the road, they should be allowed to run their natural life. They will come off the road by failure to maintain or just sheer, 'WEAR and TEAR 'and this is controlled by the twice-yearly Taxi Test, plus periodical Council Checks.

In terms of the pollution factors, the number of Licensed Euro 6-Seater Taxis is very small and frankly will not cause or contribute significantly to the overall air pollution in Chelmsford. Most of the vehicles with a Euro 5 Engines are privately owned by the general public.

It's regarding the PH operator Licence and PH vehicle age when first licence.

1-can the committee allow to give choice to apply for 1 or 2 operator licence rather than 5 years (current policy) only.

2- can the committee show flexibility to use Euro 6 vehicle to licence (First) rather than 4 years old (Current policy)

These options are being used by different authorities up and down in the country.

I am suggesting these changes because recently we are seeing PH vehicles from different authorities working in the city without plates and door stickers of their authorities in other words hiding their identity. I hope respected committee will address this issue and will encourage local operators and local vehicles to use locally for the safety of the residents of Chelmsford.
