ITEM 4 – Licensing Act 2003 – Application to vary a Premises Licence – Boom Battle Bar, 106-108 Bond Street, Chelmsford, CM1 1GH

Further Agreed Conditions

Chelmsford City Council's Business Compliance Team also agreed public safety conditions with Boom Battle Bar relating to High Risk Activity (Axe throwing), these are detailed below:

Public Safety: conditions relating to High Risk Activity (Axe throwing)

1. Axe throwing must be the 1st activity undertaken by the participant when booked as a 'bundle' or corporate event
2. A comprehensive risk assessment for axe throwing must be maintained and reviewed at least annually or following any incident.
3. CCTV must cover all axe throwing areas and be retained for a minimum of 31 days.
4. An Incident Log relating to High Risk Activity must be kept at the premises and made available to any authorised officer of Chelmsford City Council to include
 - Refusals of participation
 - Injuries or accidents
 - Near misses
 - Any disorder or aggressive behaviour
5. Any injury requiring medical treatment beyond basic first aid must be reported to the Business Compliance Team, Chelmsford City Council within 48 hours.
6. Any serious incident (e.g., ambulance attendance, police attendance, significant equipment failure) must be reported to The Business Compliance Team Chelmsford City Council
7. The licence holder must notify the Licensing Authority in writing of the proposed introduction of any new activity that could be classified as 'High Risk' at least 28 days before its introduction
