Purpose

The purpose of this report is for members to consider a Premises Licence Application made by Alliance Property Holdings Limited, under section 17 of the licensing act 2003, for a new premise licence in respect of 5 The Vineyards, Great Baddow, Chelmsford, Essex, CM2 7QS having regard to representations received and the requirement to promote the four licensing objectives. These are:

- a) The prevention of crime and disorder
- b) Public Safety
- c) The prevention of public nuisance
- d) The protection of children from harm

Recommendations

Members are advised that they have the following options when determining this application;

- Grant the application, on the terms and conditions applied for
- Grant the application on the terms and conditions applied for, modified to such extent as considered appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.
- Refuse the application in whole or in part.

An appeal in respect of any determination made in connection with this application may be made to the Magistrates Court, within 21 days of the notification given by the licensing committee, by the licence holder, Chief officer of police, or any other person making relevant representation.

1. Background

- 1.1 The area proposed is a Convenience store located within a residential area.

2. Application

- 2.1 The application has been properly given in accordance with The Licensing Act 2003 and all procedures correctly followed. The completed application form as well as the operating schedule are attached as **Appendix A**.
- 2.2 A complete application was submitted on the 29th September 2023, and correctly advertised by placing blue public notices at the premises and by publication in a local paper and on Chelmsford City Council's website.
- 2.3 The new premises licence application provides for the following licensable activities as detailed below:
Sale or supply of Alcohol Monday – Sunday 06:00 – 23:00
- 2.4 Mr Daniel Duncan has been nominated as the designated premises supervisor having obtained a personal licence from Southend Council.
- 2.5 The applicant has provided an operating schedule which promotes all four of the licensing objectives and have agreed additional conditions with Essex Police Licensing Unit.
- 2.6 Members are asked to note that as this report is available in the public domain, personal details have been redacted from some documents, however, both the Authority and the applicant have received complete copies of all documents.

3. Representations

- 3.1 During the course of the application, Chelmsford City Council, in line with the Act, sent a copy of the application to all responsible authorities.
- 3.2 During the consultation period two representations were received objecting to the application. A copy of these objections are shown as **Appendix B**.

I have been negotiations with the applicants representative and the following conditions have been agreed – If these can be added to the premises licence Essex Police have no further representations. I have added the email chain for confirmation.

1 - The premises shall have installed and maintain a closed circuit television surveillance (CCTV) system that at all times complies with the below requirements:

- i. During the hours of licensable activities, CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition;*
- ii. CCTV cameras shall cover all public areas including where the sale of alcohol takes place;*
- iii. Equipment must be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings must be kept in good working order and kept for a minimum period of {31} days;*
- iv. At all times, whilst the premises is open for licensable activities, there are members of staff able to request viewable copies of recordings from the premises licence holder's IT Dept to be urgently provided for the police or licensing authority staff upon reasonable request*
- v. The recording equipment and data storage devices shall be kept in a secure environment and fitted with security functions (such as passwords) to prevent recordings being tampered with; Any faults/defects in the CCTV system will be remedied as soon as reasonably possible*

2 - Signs must be displayed at all entrances {and exits} advising customers that CCTV is operating at the premises and shall be a minimum size of 200 x 148 mm and clearly legible at all times when the premises conducts licensable activities.

3 - No single cans of beer or cider with an ABV of over 6.5% to be offered for sale at the premises

4 - A Challenge 25 scheme shall be operated, whereby any person who appears to be under the age of 25 years of age is required to produce on request an item which meets the mandatory age verification requirement (photo, name, date of birth and either a holographic mark or ultraviolet feature) and is either a:

- Proof of age card bearing the PASS Hologram;*
- Photocard driving licence;*
- Passport*
- Ministry of Defence Identity Card.*
- Biometric Residence Permit*
- National ID issued by an EU country.*

5 - The premises shall clearly display signs at the each point of sale and in areas where alcohol is displayed advising customers that a 'Challenge 25' policy is in force.

At the point of sale, such signs shall be a minimum size of 200mm x 148mm.

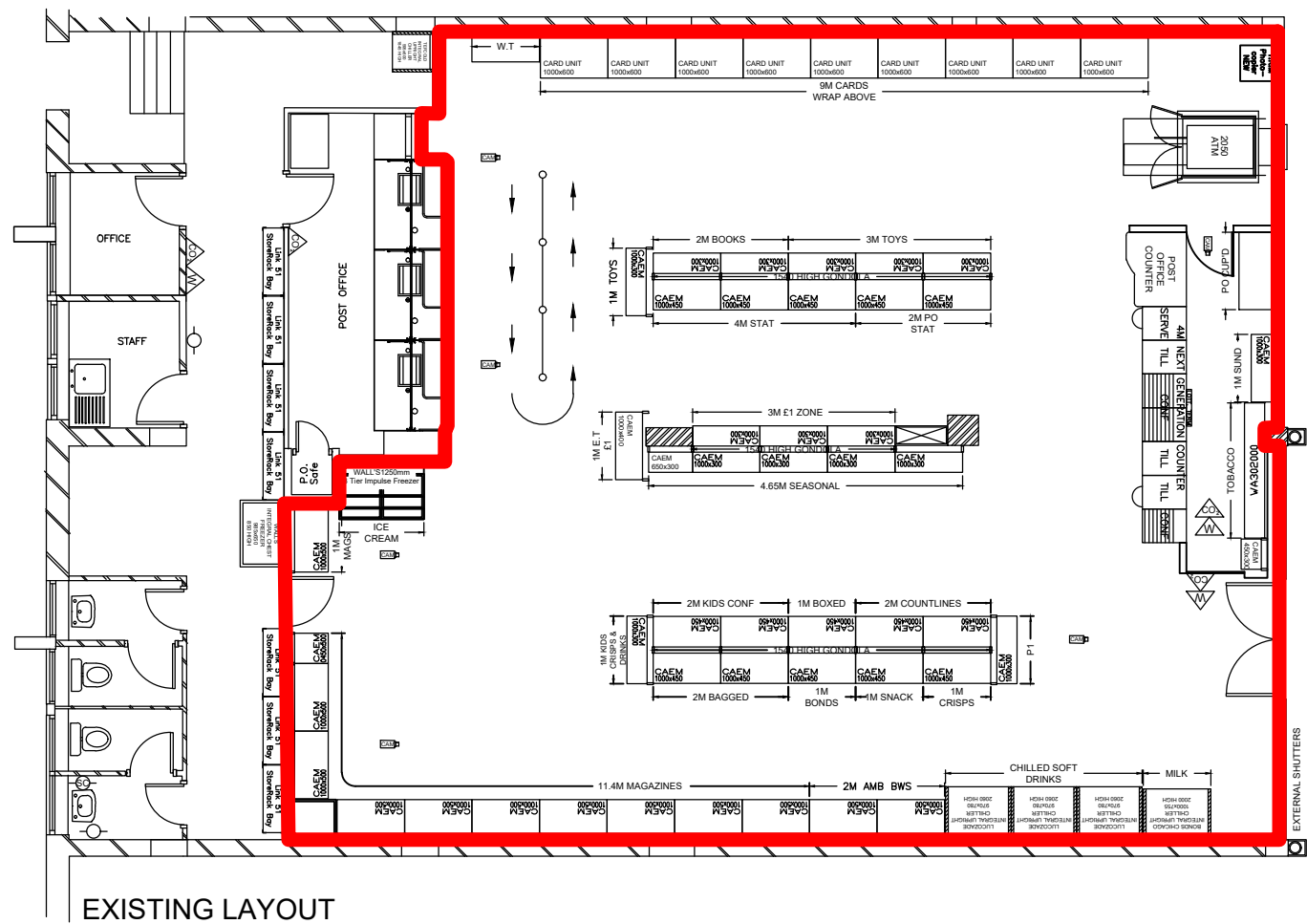
